APPLICATION:

This scholarship will be awarded to one student for the *Aerial Dance Festival 2011*. It will cover up to \$1,000 in classes during the two weeks, July 31 – August 13. Applicants must commit to these dates of attendance. The scholarship does not cover travel, room or board.

Criteria: Applicants must demonstrate some experience in aerial choreography. The recipient will be selected based on demonstrated interest and ability working with the genre of aerial dance. Applicants must be 18 years of age or older.

To Apply:

- Send one VHS videotape or DVD of a single piece of your unedited aerial choreography (including a cue sheet indicating: name of work, choreographer's name (should be your name), dancers' names, date & location of performance).
- a resume,
- two letters of recommendation,
- the application form.

Incomplete applications will not be considered. Deadline to our office (not postmark): April 10, 2011.
